Hope College Graduates Largest Class Yet

ne hundred and forty-seven 12th graders graduated from Hope College on May 12, 2018. This was the fourth and largest graduating class in the history of the school. This was also the first graduating class with some students having studied Home Economics as an elective course of study. Other members of the class studied for their elective courses in General Science, General Arts and Business.

The Hackmann Hall of Hope College was filled to capacity as parents, friends, alumni and other invited guests joined the Hope College and Village of Hope communities to bid farewell to the graduating students. Additional chairs had to be brought in for the overflow crowd to be seated on the veranda outside the hall. The Chief, Queen Mother, Elders and people of Fetteh attended the ceremony in their colorful and elegant traditional wear. The special guest of honor and keynote speaker for the occasion was Dr. James Asare-Adjei, the Chief Executive Officer of Asadtek Group, made up of manufacturing companies, real estate and other businesses. He is also the immediate past President of the Association of Ghana Industries (AGI), an umbrella body for industries in Ghana. He challenged the graduating students to go out and make a difference in the world, advising them to begin by identifying needs wherever they find themselves and selflessly serving to meet the needs they find and to voluntarily help people.
